April 14, 2021, Introduced by Senator SANTANA and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2011 PA 256, entitled "Michigan fireworks safety act,"

by amending section 7 (MCL 28.457), as amended by 2018 PA 635.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7. (1) Except as provided in this act, a local unit of
- 2 government shall not enact or enforce an ordinance, code, or
- 3 regulation pertaining that pertains to or regulates in any manner
- 4 regulating the sale, display, storage, transportation, or
- 5 distribution of fireworks regulated under this act.
- 6 (2) A local unit of government may enact an ordinance

- 1 regulating that regulates the ignition, discharge, and use of
- 2 consumer fireworks, including, but not limited to, an ordinance
- 3 prescribing the hours of the day or night during which a person may
- 4 ignite, discharge, or use consumer fireworks. If a local unit of
- 5 government enacts an ordinance under this subsection, the ordinance
- 6 shall not regulate the ignition, discharge, or use of consumer
- 7 fireworks on the following days after 11 a.m.:
- 8 (a) December 31 until 1 a.m. on January 1.
- 9 (b) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day 10 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- 11 (c) June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- 12 (d) July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45
- 13 p.m.
- 14 (e) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day
- 15 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- 16 (f) June 18 and 19 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- 17 (3) An ordinance under subsection (2) shall must impose a
- 18 civil fine of \$1,000.00 for each violation of the ordinance and no
- 19 other fine or sanction. The ordinance must provide for the
- 20 remittance of \$500.00 of the fine collected under the ordinance to
- 21 the local law enforcement agency responsible for enforcing the
- 22 ordinance.
- 23 (4) Beginning August 1, 2019, a local unit of government with
- 24 a population of 100,000 or more or a local unit of government
- 25 located in a county with a population of 750,000 or more may enact
- 26 or enforce an ordinance that regulates the use of a temporary
- 27 structure. An ordinance established under this subsection may
- 28 include, but is not limited to, a restriction on the number of
- 29 permits issued for a temporary structure, regulation of the

- 1 distance required between 2 or more temporary structures, or a
- 2 zoning ordinance that regulates the use of a temporary structure.
- 3 An ordinance established under this subsection may not prohibit the
- 4 temporary storage, transportation, or distribution of fireworks by
- 5 a consumer fireworks certificate holder at a retail location that
- 6 is a permanent building or structure. As used in this subsection,
- 7 "temporary structure" means a movable structure that is used in the
- 8 sale, display, storage, transportation, or distribution of
- 9 fireworks, including, but not limited to, a tent or a stand.
- 10 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 11 unless Senate Bill No. 74 of the 101st Legislature is enacted into
- **12** law.
