SENATE BILL NO. 1097

June 23, 2022, Introduced by Senators WOJNO, MOSS, BAYER, BRINKS, POLEHANKI, GEISS, SANTANA, MCMORROW, MCCANN, CHANG, HERTEL, MCBROOM and IRWIN and referred to the Committee on Education and Career Readiness.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an

- endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in anelementary grade in the public schools of the state.
- 3 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
 4 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
 5 certificate to an individual who has passed appropriate
 6 examinations as follows:
- 7 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed the
 8 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
 9 area in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 10 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed,
 11 if it is available, the elementary certification examination, and
 12 has passed the appropriate available subject area examination for
 13 each subject area, if any, in which he or she applies to be
 14 certified.
- 15 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
 16 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
 17 teaching certificate to an individual holding a certificate from
 18 another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher
 19 preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teaching
 20 certificate only if the individual passes meets either of the
 21 following, as applicable:
- 22 (a) Passes appropriate examinations as follows:

- (i) (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass the appropriate available subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she applies to be certified. The superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public instruction to meet this requirement.
- 29 (\ddot{u}) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass, if

- 1 it is available, the elementary certification examination, and pass
- 2 the appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 3 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified. The
- 4 superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an
- 5 equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public
- 6 instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 7 (b) Has obtained 3 successful performance evaluations for his
- 8 or her teaching in the other state in which his or her teaching
- 9 certificate was valid within the 5 years before the individual
- 10 applies for a teaching certificate in this state.
- 11 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 12 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 13 certificate to an individual who has met the elementary or
- 14 secondary, as applicable, reading credit requirements established
- 15 under superintendent of public instruction rule. If an individual
- 16 holds a teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009,
- 17 notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of
- 18 public instruction shall not advance the individual's certification
- 19 to professional certification unless the individual has
- 20 successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of study with
- 21 appropriate field experiences in the diagnosis and remediation of
- 22 reading disabilities and differentiated instruction. To meet this
- 23 requirement, the course of study should include the following
- 24 elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the
- 25 individual's certification level and endorsements: interest
- 26 inventories, English language learning screening, visual and
- 27 auditory discrimination tools, language expression and processing
- 28 screening, phonemics, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension,
- 29 spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional

strategies. An individual may complete the course of study either
as part of his or her teacher preparation program or during the
first 6 years of his or her employment in classroom teaching.

- 4 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading disorders.
- 10 (6) Subject to subsection (8), if an individual holding a 11 teaching certificate from another state applies to the superintendent of public instruction for a Michigan teaching 12 certificate and meets the requirements of this subsection, the 13 14 superintendent of public instruction shall issue to the individual 15 a Michigan professional education teaching certificate and 16 applicable endorsements comparable to those the individual holds in 17 the other state, without requiring the individual to pass the 18 applicable subject area examination otherwise required under subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan 19 20 professional education teaching certificate under this subsection, an individual shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department 21 that he or she meets all of the following requirements: 22
- (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a positionfor which the individual's teaching certification from the otherstate was valid.
- (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned course of study at an institution of higher education approved by the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any

- 1 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
 2 of public instruction.
- 3 (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
 4 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
 5 public instruction rule.
- 6 (7) An individual who receives a teaching certificate and
 7 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to
 8 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
 9 endorsements the individual holds in another state only if the
 10 individual passes the appropriate subject area examinations
 11 required under subsection (2) or (3).
- 12 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
 13 Michigan teaching certificate to an individual described in
 14 subsection (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or
 15 concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or
 16 for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may
 17 be revoked under section 1535a.
- 22 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of 23 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 24 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or 25 more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of 26 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 27 subsection (11), shall approve an elementary certification 28 examination and a reading subject area examination. If the 29 department develops for use under this subsection an examination

- 1 that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid
- 2 process, then the department shall not expend on the development of
- 3 that examination an amount that exceeds the amount that the
- 4 department expended on procurement of the most recent
- 5 competitively-bid version of that examination.
- 6 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an
- 7 11-member teacher examination advisory committee composed of
- 8 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and
- 9 Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than
- 10 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be certified
- 11 teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be used by the
- 12 superintendent of public instruction in the development, selection,
- 13 or development and selection of subject area examinations. In
- 14 addition, the committee shall recommend guidelines for the use and
- 15 administration of those examinations.
- 16 (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a
- 17 7-member standing technical advisory council composed of
- 18 individuals who are experts in measurement and assessment. This
- 19 council shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and
- 20 the teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and
- 21 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or
- 22 are being used and of the administration and use of those
- 23 examinations.
- 24 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 26 report on the development or selection and use of the elementary
- 27 certification examination and the subject area examinations to the
- 28 house and senate education committees. The report shall also
- 29 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the

- assessment of fees levied under subsection (15) and the amount ofand any purposes for which that revenue was expended.
- 3 (14) The elementary certification examination and the subject 4 area examinations required by this section may be taken at 5 different times during an approved teacher preparation program, but 6 the elementary certification examination and the subject area 7 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is

recommended for certification.

- 9 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of 10 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for 11 taking the elementary certification examination and the subject 12 area examinations. The fees, which shall be set by the superintendent of public instruction, shall not exceed the actual 13 14 cost of the examination and of administering the examination. Fees 15 received by the department shall be expended solely for 16 administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing this section. If the superintendent of public instruction increases a 17 18 fee charged for an examination under this subsection, at least 1 19 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall 20 notify each approved teacher education institution of the amount of 21 the fee increase. An approved teacher education institution shall notify each of its affected students of the timing and amount of 22 23 such a fee increase.
 - (16) If an individual holding a teaching certificate from another state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage of the appropriate examinations the requirements under subsection (3), the superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable temporary teaching certificate, good for 1

year, to the individual. The superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan teaching certificate to the individual after expiration of the temporary teaching certificate unless the individual passes appropriate examinations as described in meets the requirements under subsection (3).

(17) As used in this section:

 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has been developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.

(b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to a specific area of certification, which examination has been developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.

- (17) (18)—The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.
- (18) (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state elementary or secondary continuing education certificates under R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan Administrative Code to individuals who completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state elementary or secondary professional education certificate to an

- 1 individual described in this section, the superintendent of public
- 2 instruction shall consider the individual to have a state
- 3 elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing education
- 4 certificate.
- 5 (19) (20) Not later than January 1, 2019, the superintendent
- 6 of public instruction, in consultation with the department of
- 7 talent and economic development labor and economic opportunity and
- 8 groups or individuals representing employers, economic development
- 9 agencies, trade unions, secondary school principals, middle and
- 10 elementary school principals, teachers, school district and
- 11 intermediate school district superintendents, and others as
- 12 determined appropriate by the department, shall promulgate rules to
- 13 allow an individual to use time spent engaging with local employers
- 14 or technical centers toward the renewal of a teaching certificate
- 15 in the same manner as state continuing education or professional
- 16 development.
- 17 (20) As used in this section:
- 18 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 19 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 20 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 21 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 22 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 23 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 24 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 25 (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 26 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 27 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 28 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 29 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not

1 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
