THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the

- 3 Sec. 5. Except as otherwise authorized or required by a law of

- 7 to or receive a service from the place of public accommodation.
- 8 Sec. 7. (1) An individual may bring a civil action against a
