## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.339

Reps. Kuppa, Breen, Clemente, Garza, Haadsma, Hope, Cynthia Johnson, Morse, Rogers, Sneller, Sowerby and Stone offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare September 21, 2022, as Michigan Peace
- 2 Day and International Day of Peace in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Since 1981, the United Nations (UN) has designated
- 4 September 21st as International Day of Peace, also known as Peace
- 5 Day, to provide "a globally shared date for all humanity to commit
- 6 to peace above all differences and to contribute to building a
- 7 culture of peace"; and
- 8 Whereas, The theme of International Day of Peace 2022 is "End
- 9 Racism. Build Peace."; and
- 10 Whereas, Michigan is a strong and diverse state that is home
- 11 to people of all backgrounds and beliefs; and

- Whereas, The UN General Assembly has declared this a day 1 "devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, through observing 24 2 hours of non-violence and cease-fire"; and 3 4 Whereas, The UN has also acknowledged that "achieving true 5 peace entails much more than laying down arms. It requires the 6 building of societies where all members feel that they can 7 flourish. It involves creating a world in which people are treated 8 equally"; and 9 Whereas, In the United States, Michigan is bound by the 10 promise made in the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth 11 Amendment to the United States Constitution, which provides that 12 "nor shall any State ... deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws"; and 13 14 Whereas, Michigan's own State Constitution affirms this 15 sentiment, stating that "No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws; nor shall any person be denied the 16 enjoyment of his civil or political rights or be discriminated 17 18 against in the exercise thereof because of religion, race, color or national origin"; now, therefore, be it 19 20 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare September 21, 2022, as Michigan Peace 21 Day and International Day of Peace in the state of Michigan; and be 22 23 it further Resolved, That it is with great honor and appreciation that we 24 25 take this time to join other states and nations in expressing our
- take this time to join other states and nations in expressing our commitment to healing divisions, particularly racial divisions, and promoting peace in all aspects of life; and be it further
- Resolved, That as we recognize the interconnectedness of humanity and global challenges, we also recognize our duty as

- 1 Michiganders to internalize and strive for the ideals of peace, and
- 2 instill a sense of pride in ourselves and our children for future
- 3 generations.
