HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.116

Reps. Anthony, Hope, Hood, Aiyash, Stone, Pohutsky, Cynthia Johnson, Young, Sneller, Sowerby, Hammoud, Ellison, Camilleri, Cavanagh, Brixie, Brabec, Neeley, Whitsett and Jones offered the following resolution:

- A resolution to urge the federal government to provide
 equitable federal student loan forgiveness.
- 3 Whereas, There is a student loan debt crisis in the United
- 4 States, with nearly 45 million people holding over \$1.7 trillion in
- 5 student loan debt. The average amount owed tops \$30,000, with some
- 6 borrowers carrying debt well into six-figures. Student loan debt is
- 7 now the second highest consumer debt category behind mortgage debt;
- 8 and
- 9 Whereas, The massive amount of student loan debt burdens not
- 10 just those people holding the debt, but the entire economy. Because

- 1 of this debt, many Americans are struggling to become homeowners,
- 2 save for retirement, and contribute to the economy in other ways.
- 3 Borrowers who face difficulty paying their debt face delinquency
- 4 and default; and
- 5 Whereas, The federal government must act swiftly and
- 6 decisively to equitably deal with the student loan debt crisis.
- 7 Legislation to cancel some student loan debt and otherwise mitigate
- 8 this problem has been introduced in Congress. Many have also called
- 9 on the President to take executive action to address this debt. For
- 10 instance, one congressional proposal provides for the cancellation
- 11 of up to \$50,000 of federal student loan debt for those with an
- 12 annual income of \$125,000 or less. Now is time to turn this or a
- 13 similar proposal into reality; now, therefore, be it
- 14 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the
- 15 federal government to provide equitable federal student loan
- 16 forgiveness; and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 18 President of the United States, the President of the United States
- 19 Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives,
- 20 and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation.
