Messages from the Senate

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 5.

A concurrent resolution to waive the legislative notice requirement for increases in rates of compensation for certain employees in the state classified service.

Whereas, The Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963 provides in Article XI, Section 5: Increases in rates of compensation authorized by the commission may be effective only at the start of a fiscal year and shall require prior notice to the governor, who shall transmit such increases to the legislature as part of his budget. The legislature may, by a majority vote of the members elected to and serving in each house, waive the notice and permit increases in rates of compensation to be effective at a time other than the start of a fiscal year.

Whereas, Agreements were reached between the state and the Michigan Corrections Organization, AFSCME Council 25, the Michigan State Employees Association, the Service Employees International Union Local 517M Scientific and Engineering Unit, the Service Employees International Union Local 517M Technical Unit, the UAW International and its Local 6000 to increase rates of compensation for exclusively represented positions in certain classifications; and

Whereas, On July 25 and December 19, 2022, the Civil Service Commission approved the agreements, and also approved increases in the rates of compensation for non-exclusively represented positions in certain classifications, past the time when the Governor could transmit the increases as part of the budget; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), That, pursuant to Article XI, Section 5 of the *Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963*, the Michigan Legislature waives the prior notice requirement to permit increases in rates of compensation as described in the approved agreements between the state and exclusive representatives for exclusively represented positions, and as approved by the Civil Service Commission for non-exclusively represented positions; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the Civil Service Commission.

The Senate has adopted the concurrent resolution.

The concurrent resolution was referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," (MCL 168.1 to 168.992) by adding section 634b. The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Elections.

Reps. Hope, Brixie, Tsernoglou, Andrews, Snyder, Wilson, Dievendorf, Young, Hood and Breen introduced House Bill No. 4034, entitled

A bill to regulate temporary labor service agencies, their clients, and temporary laborers; to prohibit retaliation for exercising rights granted under this act; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide remedies and sanctions.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Labor.

Reps. Hope, Brixie, Tsernoglou, Andrews, Wilson, Dievendorf, Young, Hood and Breen introduced House Bill No. 4035, entitled

A bill to require certain employers to provide written work schedules to certain employees; to require compensation for changes to a work schedule in certain circumstances; to allow employees to request changes to work schedules; to prohibit employers from requiring employees to work during certain rest periods; to require certain notices and postings; to prohibit retaliation; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide remedies and sanctions.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Labor.

Reps. Zorn and Slagh introduced

House Bill No. 4036, entitled

A bill to prohibit municipalities from imposing a ban on the use of natural gas or the installation of natural gas infrastructure; to provide for the powers and duties of certain local governmental officers and entities; and to provide that certain local ordinances, resolutions, or policies are void and unenforceable.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation.

Rep. Paquette introduced

House Bill No. 4037, entitled

A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled "Income tax act of 1967," by amending section 51 (MCL 206.51), as amended by 2020 PA 75.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

Rep. Paquette introduced

House Bill No. 4038, entitled

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," by amending section 1233 (MCL 380.1233), as amended by 2021 PA 149.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Education.
