May 07, 2024, Introduced by Senators VICTORY, MCBROOM, GEISS, IRWIN, CHANG, SHINK, SANTANA, CAVANAGH, WOJNO and BAYER and referred to the Committee on Civil Rights, Judiciary, and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 1985 PA 87, entitled "William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights act," by amending sections 13 and 41 (MCL 780.763 and 780.791), section 41 as amended by 2000 PA 503.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 13. (1) The prosecuting attorney, upon and in accordance with the request of the victim, shall give to the victim notice of the following:
- 4 (a) The defendant's conviction.
- 5 (b) The crimes for which the defendant was convicted.

- (c) The victim's right to make a written or oral impact
 statement for use in the preparation of a presentence investigation
 report concerning the defendant.
 - (d) The address and telephone number of the probation office which is to that will prepare the presentence investigation report.
- 6 (e) That a presentence investigation report and any statement
 7 of the victim included in the report will be made available to the
 8 defendant unless exempted from disclosure by the court.
- 9 (f) The victim's right to make an impact statement at 10 sentencing.

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- (g) The time and place of the sentencing proceeding.
- (h) Whether the defendant may be eligible to earn productivity credits under section 33a of 1893 PA 118, MCL 800.33a, that could reduce a sentence of imprisonment.
- 15 (2) The notice given by the prosecuting attorney to the victim 16 must be given by any means reasonably calculated to give prompt 17 actual notice.
- 18 (3) A notice given under subsection (1) shall must inform the
 19 victim that his or her the victim's impact statement may include,
 20 but shall is not be limited to, any of the following:
 - (a) An explanation of the nature and extent of any physical, psychological, or emotional harm or trauma suffered by the victim.
- (b) An explanation of the extent of any economic loss orproperty damage suffered by the victim.
- (c) An opinion of the need for and extent of restitution and whether the victim has applied for or received compensation for loss or damage.
- 28 (d) The victim's recommendation for an appropriate sentence.
- Sec. 41. (1) The prosecuting attorney, or, pursuant to an

- 6 (d) The victim's recommendation for an appropriate disposition

- 8 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect January
- 9 1, 2026.
- 10 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 11 unless Senate Bill No. 861 of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into
- 12 law.
