## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4340**

March 23, 2023, Introduced by Reps. VanderWall, Aiyash, Rogers, Pohutsky, Rheingans, DeBoer, O'Neal, Hill, Glanville, Wegela, Neeley, Young, Brixie, Hood, Scott, Haadsma, Roth, Grant, Hope, Paiz, Fitzgerald, Andrews, Wilson, Liberati, Stone, Steckloff, Dievendorf, Byrnes, Edwards, Coleman, Koleszar, Morse, Miller, Bezotte, Neyer, Markkanen, Churches, Skaggs, Farhat and Puri and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 116, entitled

"An act to provide for the protection of children through the licensing and regulation of child care organizations; to provide for the establishment of standards of care for child care organizations; to prescribe powers and duties of certain departments of this state and adoption facilitators; to provide penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 722.111), as amended by 2022 PA 208, and by adding section 3i.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Child care staff member" means an individual who is 16

- 1 years of age or older to whom 1 or more of the following apply:
- 2 (i) The individual is employed by a child care center, group
- 3 child care home, or family child care home for compensation,
- 4 including a contract employee or a self-employed individual.
- 5 (ii) An individual whose activities involve the unsupervised
- 6 care or supervision of children for a child care center, group
- 7 child care home, or family child care home.
- 8 (iii) An individual who has unsupervised access to children who
- 9 are cared for or supervised by a child care center, group child
- 10 care home, or family child care home.
- 11 (iv) An individual who acts in the role of a licensee designee
- 12 or program director.
- 13 (b) "Child care organization" means a governmental or
- 14 nongovernmental organization having as its principal function
- 15 receiving minor children for care, maintenance, training, and
- 16 supervision, notwithstanding that educational instruction may be
- 17 given. Child care organization includes organizations commonly
- 18 described as child caring institutions, child placing agencies,
- 19 children's camps, children's campsites, children's therapeutic
- 20 group homes, child care centers, day care centers, nursery schools,
- 21 parent cooperative preschools, foster homes, group homes, or child
- 22 care homes. Child care organization does not include a governmental
- 23 or nongovernmental organization that does either of the following:
- 24 (i) Provides care exclusively to minors who have been
- 25 emancipated by court order under section 4(3) of 1968 PA 293, MCL
- **26** 722.4.
- (ii) Provides care exclusively to persons who are 18 years of
- 28 age or older and to minors who have been emancipated by court order
- 29 under section 4(3) of 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.4, at the same location.

- 1 (c) "Child caring institution" means a child care facility
- 2 that is organized for the purpose of receiving minor children for
- 3 care, maintenance, and supervision, usually on a 24-hour basis, in
- 4 buildings maintained by the child caring institution for that
- 5 purpose, and operates throughout the year. An educational program
- 6 may be provided, but the educational program shall not be the
- 7 primary purpose of the facility. Child caring institution includes
- 8 a maternity home for the care of unmarried mothers who are minors
- 9 and an agency group home, that is described as a small child caring
- 10 institution, owned, leased, or rented by a licensed agency
- 11 providing care for more than 4 but less than 13 minor children.
- 12 Child caring institution also includes an institution for
- 13 developmentally disabled or emotionally disturbed minor children.
- 14 Child caring institution does not include a hospital, nursing home,
- 15 or home for the aged licensed under article 17 of the public health
- 16 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20101 to 333.22260, a boarding school
- 17 licensed under section 1335 of the revised school code, 1976 PA
- 18 451, MCL 380.1335, a hospital or facility operated by the state or
- 19 licensed under the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1001 to
- 20 330.2106, or an adult foster care family home or an adult foster
- 21 care small group home licensed under the adult foster care facility
- 22 licensing act, 1979 PA 218, MCL 400.701 to 400.737, in which a
- 23 child has been placed under section 5(6).
- 24 (d) "Child caring institution staff member" means an
- 25 individual who is 18 years of age or older to whom 1 or more of the
- 26 following apply:
- 27 (i) The individual is employed by a child caring institution
- 28 for compensation, including an adult who does not work directly
- 29 with children.

- (ii) The individual is a contract employee or self-employed
   individual with a child caring institution.
- 3 (iii) The individual is an intern or other individual who provides specific services under the rules promulgated under this act.
- 6 (e) "Child placing agency" means a governmental organization 7 or an agency organized under the nonprofit corporation act, 1982 PA 8 162, MCL 450.2101 to 450.3192, for the purpose of receiving children for placement in private family homes for foster care or 9 10 for adoption. The function of a child placing agency may include 11 investigating applicants for adoption and investigating and 12 certifying foster family homes and foster family group homes as 13 provided in this act. The function of a child placing agency may 14 also include supervising children who are at least 16 but less than 15 21 years of age and who are living in unlicensed residences as 16 provided in section 5(4).
- 17 (f) "Children's camp" means a residential, day, troop, or
  18 travel camp that provides care and supervision and is conducted in
  19 a natural environment for more than 4 children, apart from the
  20 children's parents, relatives, or legal guardians, for 5 or more
  21 days in a 14-day period.
- 22 (g) "Children's campsite" means the outdoor setting where a
  23 children's residential or day camp is located.
- (h) "Children's therapeutic group home" means a child caring institution receiving not more than 6 minor children who are diagnosed with a developmental disability as defined in section 100a of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100a, or a serious emotional disturbance as defined in section 100d of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100d, and that meets all

- 1 of the following requirements:
- 2 (i) Provides care, maintenance, and supervision, usually on a 24-hour basis.
- 4 (ii) Complies with the rules for child caring institutions,
  5 except that behavior management rooms, personal restraint,
  6 mechanical restraint, or seclusion, which is allowed in certain
  7 circumstances under licensing rules, are prohibited in a children's
  8 therapeutic group home.
- 9 (iii) Is not a private home.

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- 10 (iv) Is not located on a campus with other licensed facilities.
- (i) "Child care center" means a facility, other than a private 11 residence, receiving 1 or more children under 13 years of age for 12 care for periods of less than 24 hours a day, where the parents or 13 14 quardians are not immediately available to the child. Child care 15 center includes a facility that provides care for not less than 2 16 consecutive weeks, regardless of the number of hours of care per 17 day. The facility is generally described as a child care center, day care center, day nursery, nursery school, parent cooperative 18 19 preschool, play group, before- or after-school program, or drop-in 20 center. Child care center does not include any of the following:
  - (i) A Sunday school, a vacation bible school, or a religious instructional class that is conducted by a religious organization where children are attending for not more than 3 hours per day for an indefinite period or for not more than 8 hours per day for a period not to exceed 4 weeks during a 12-month period.
- (ii) A facility operated by a religious organization where
  children are in the religious organization's care for not more than
  3 hours while persons responsible for the children are attending
  religious services.

- 6 (iv) A program that is primarily an incident of group athletic 7 or social activities for school-age children sponsored by or under 8 the supervision of an organized club or hobby group, including, but 9 not limited to, youth clubs, scouting, and school-age recreational 10 or supplementary education programs. This exclusion applies only to 11 the time the school-age child is engaged in the group athletic or 12 social activities and if the school-age child can come and go at 13 will.
- 14 (v) A program that primarily provides therapeutic services to a child.
- (j) "Conviction" means a final conviction, the payment of a
  fine, a plea of guilty or nolo contendere if accepted by the court,
  a finding of guilt for a criminal law violation or a juvenile
  adjudication or disposition by the juvenile division of probate
  court or family division of circuit court for a violation that if
  committed by an adult would be a crime, or a conviction in a tribal
  court or a military court.
  - (k) "Criminal history check" means a fingerprint-based criminal history record information background check through the department of state police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- (1) "Criminal history record information" means that term asdefined in section 1a of 1925 PA 289, MCL 28.241a.

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(m) "Department" means the department of health and humanservices and the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or

- 1 a successor agency or department responsible for licensure under
- 2 this act. The department of licensing and regulatory affairs is
- 3 responsible for licensing and regulatory matters for child care
- 4 centers, group child care homes, family child care homes,
- 5 children's camps, and children's campsites. The department of
- 6 health and human services is responsible for licensing and
- 7 regulatory matters for child caring institutions, child placing
- 8 agencies, children's therapeutic group homes, foster family homes,
- 9 and foster family group homes.

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- (n) "Drinking fountain" means a plumbing fixture that is connected to the potable water distribution system and the drainage system and allows the user to obtain a drink directly from a stream of flowing water without the use of any accessory.
- (o) (n) "Eligible" means that the individual obtained the checks and clearances described in sections 5n and 5q and is considered appropriate to obtain a license, to be a member of the household of a group child care home or family child care home, or to be a child care staff member.
- 19 (p) "Faucet" means a valve end of a water pipe by which water 20 is drawn from or held within the pipe.
  - (q) "Filtered bottle-filling station" or "station" means an apparatus that meets all of the following requirements:
- 23 (i) Is connected to customer site piping.
- 24 (ii) Filters water and is certified to meet NSF/ANSI standard 25 53 for lead reduction and NSF/ANSI standard 42 for particulate 26 removal.
- 27 (iii) The flow rate through the station is paired to the 28 specified flow rate of the filter cartridge.
- 29 (iv) Has a light or other device to indicate filter use.

- 1 ( $\nu$ ) Is designed to fill drinking bottles or other containers 2 for personal water consumption.
- 3 (vi) Includes a drinking fountain.

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- 4 (r) "Filtered faucet" means a faucet that at the point of use 5 includes a filter that is certified to meet NSF/ANSI standard 53 6 for lead reduction and NSF/ANSI standard 42 for particulate 7 removal.
- 8 (s) "Filtered pitcher" means a container used for holding and 9 pouring liquids that at the point of use includes a filter that is 10 certified to meet NSF/ANSI standard 53 for lead reduction and 11 NSF/ANSI standard 42 for particulate removal.
- (t) (e) "Ineligible" means that the individual obtained the checks and clearances as described in sections 5n and 5q and is not considered appropriate to obtain a license, to be a member of the household of a group child care home or family child care home, or to be a child care staff member due to violation of section 5n, 5q, or 5r.
- - (v) (q)—"Private home" means a private residence in which the licensee permanently resides, which residency is not contingent upon caring for children or employment by a child placing agency. Private home includes a full-time foster family home, a full-time foster family group home, a group child care home, or a family child care home, as follows:
- 29 (i) "Foster family home" means the private home of an

- 1 individual who is licensed to provide 24-hour care for 1 but not
- 2 more than 4 minor children who are placed away from their parent,
- 3 legal guardian, or legal custodian in foster care. The licensed
- 4 individual providing care is required to comply with the reasonable
- 5 and prudent parenting standard as defined in section 1 of chapter
- 6 XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.1.
- 7 (ii) "Foster family group home" means the private home of an
- 8 individual who has been licensed by the department to provide 24-
- 9 hour care for more than 4 but fewer than 7 minor children who are
- 10 placed away from their parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian
- 11 in foster care. The licensed individual providing care is required
- 12 to comply with the reasonable and prudent parenting standard as
- 13 defined in section 1 of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939,
- 14 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.1.
- 15 (iii) "Family child care home" means a private home in which 1
- 16 but fewer than 7 minor children are received for care and
- 17 supervision for compensation for periods of less than 24 hours a
- 18 day, unattended by a parent or legal guardian, except children
- 19 related to an adult member of the household. Family child care home
- 20 includes a home in which care is given to an unrelated minor child
- 21 for more than 4 weeks during a calendar year. A family child care
- 22 home does not include an individual providing babysitting services
- 23 for another individual. As used in this subparagraph, "providing
- 24 babysitting services" means caring for a child on behalf of the
- 25 child's parent or guardian if the annual compensation for providing
- 26 those services does not equal or exceed \$600.00 or an amount that
- 27 would according to the internal revenue code of 1986 obligate the
- 28 child's parent or guardian to provide a form 1099-MISC to the
- 29 individual for compensation paid during the calendar year for those

- services. Family child care home includes a private home withincreased capacity.
- ${f 3}$  ( iv ) "Group child care home" means a private home in which more
- 4 than 6 but not more than 12 minor children are given care and
- 5 supervision for periods of less than 24 hours a day unattended by a
- 6 parent or legal guardian, except children related to an adult
- 7 member of the household. Group child care home includes a home in
- 8 which care is given to an unrelated minor child for more than 4
- 9 weeks during a calendar year. Group child care home includes a
- 10 private home with increased capacity.
- 11 (w) (r) "Legal custodian" means an individual who is at least
- 12 18 years of age in whose care a minor child remains or is placed
- 13 after a court makes a finding under section 13a(5) of chapter XIIA
- 14 of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.13a.
- 15 (x) (s) "Legal entity" means a sole proprietorship,
- 16 partnership, corporation, limited liability company, or any other
- 17 entity.
- 18 (y) (t) "Licensee" means a person, legal entity organized
- 19 under a law of this state, state or local government, or trust that
- 20 has been issued a license under this act to operate a child care
- 21 organization.
- 22 (z) (u) "Listed offense" means that term as defined in section
- 23 2 of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.722.
- 24 (aa) (v) "Member of the household" means any individual who
- 25 resides in a family child care home, group child care home, foster
- 26 family home, or foster family group home on an ongoing basis, or
- 27 who has a recurrent presence in the home, including, but not
- 28 limited to, overnight stays. For foster family homes and foster
- 29 family group homes, a member of the household does not include a

- 1 foster child. For group child care homes and family child care
- 2 homes, a member of the household does not include a child to whom
- 3 child care is being provided.
- 4 (bb) (w) "Original license" means a license issued to a child
- 5 care organization during the first 6 months of operation indicating
- 6 that the organization is in compliance with all rules promulgated
- 7 by the department under this act.
- 8 (cc) (x) "Provisional license" means a license issued to a
- 9 child care organization that is temporarily unable to conform to
- 10 the rules promulgated under this act.
- (dd) (y) "Qualified residential treatment program" or "QRTP"
- 12 means a program within a child caring institution to which all of
- 13 the following apply:
- 14 (i) The program has a trauma-informed treatment model,
- 15 evidenced by the inclusion of trauma awareness, knowledge, and
- 16 skills into the program's culture, practices, and policies.
- 17 (ii) The program has registered or licensed nursing and other
- 18 licensed clinical staff on-site or available 24 hours a day, 7 days
- 19 a week, who provide care in the scope of their practice as provided
- 20 in parts 170, 172, 181, 182, 182A, and 185 of the public health
- 21 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.17001 to 333.17097, 333.17201 to
- 22 333.17242, 333.18101 to 333.18117, 333.18201 to 333.18237,
- 23 333.18251 to 333.18267, and 333.18501 to 333.18518.
- 24 (iii) The program integrates families into treatment, including
- 25 maintaining sibling connections.
- (iv) The program provides aftercare services for at least 6
- 27 months post discharge.
- 28 (v) The program is accredited by an independent not-for-profit
- 29 organization as described in 42 USC 672(k)(4)(G).

- 1 (vi) The program does not include a detention facility,
- 2 forestry camp, training school, or other facility operated
- 3 primarily for detaining minor children who are determined to be
- 4 delinquent.
- 5 (ee) (z) "Regular license" means a license issued to a child
- 6 care organization indicating that the organization is in
- 7 substantial compliance with all rules promulgated under this act
- 8 and, if there is a deficiency, has entered into a corrective action
- 9 plan.
- 10 (ff) (aa) "Guardian" means the guardian of the person.
- 11 (gg) (bb) "Minor child" means any of the following:
- 12 (i) A person less than 18 years of age.
- 13 (ii) A person who is a resident in a child caring institution,
- 14 foster family home, or foster family group home, who is at least 18
- 15 but less than 21 years of age, and who meets the requirements of
- 16 the young adult voluntary foster care act, 2011 PA 225, MCL 400.641
- **17** to 400.671.
- 18 (iii) A person who is a resident in a child caring institution,
- 19 children's camp, foster family home, or foster family group home;
- 20 who becomes 18 years of age while residing in a child caring
- 21 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 22 group home; and who continues residing in a child caring
- 23 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 24 group home to receive care, maintenance, training, and supervision.
- 25 A minor child under this subparagraph does not include a person 18
- 26 years of age or older who is placed in a child caring institution,
- 27 foster family home, or foster family group home under an
- 28 adjudication under section 2(a) of chapter XIIA of the probate code
- 29 of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.2, or under section 1 of chapter IX

- 1 of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.1. This
- 2 subparagraph applies only if the number of those residents who
- 3 become 18 years of age does not exceed the following:
- 4 (A) Two, if the total number of residents is 10 or fewer.
- 5 (B) Three, if the total number of residents is not less than 6 11 and not more than 14.
- 7 (C) Four, if the total number of residents is not less than 15 8 and not more than 20.
- 9 (D) Five, if the total number of residents is 21 or more.
- (iv) A person 18 years of age or older who is placed in an unlicensed residence under section 5(4) or a foster family home under section 5(7).
- (hh) (cc) "Related" means 1 of the following:
- 14 (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii), a relative as defined in section 13a of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 16 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.13a.
- 17 (ii) For licensing by the department related to a child care 18 center, children's camp, children's campsite, family child care 19 home, foster family home, foster family group home, or group child 20 care home, in the relationship by blood, marriage, or adoption, as parent, grandparent, great-grandparent, great-grandparent, 21 22 aunt or uncle, great-aunt or great-uncle, great-great-aunt or 23 great-great-uncle, sibling, stepsibling, nephew or niece, first 24 cousin or first cousin once removed, and the spouse of any of the 25 individuals described in this definition, even after the marriage 26 has ended by death or divorce.
- (ii) (dd)—"Religious organization" means a church,
   ecclesiastical corporation, or group, not organized for pecuniary
   profit, that gathers for mutual support and edification in piety or

- 1 worship of a supreme deity.
- 2 (jj) <del>(ce) "School-age child" means a child who is eligible to</del>
- 3 attend a grade of kindergarten or higher, but is less than 13 years
- 4 of age. A child is considered to be a school-age child on the first
- 5 day of the school year in which he or she is eligible to attend
- 6 school.
- 7 (kk) (ff) "Severe physical injury" means serious physical harm
- 8 as that term is defined in section 136b of the Michigan penal code,
- 9 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.136b.
- 10 (ll) (gg)—"Licensee designee" means the individual designated
- 11 in writing by the board of directors of the corporation or by the
- 12 owner or person with legal authority to act on behalf of the
- 13 company or organization on licensing matters. The individual must
- 14 agree in writing to be designated as the licensee designee. All
- 15 license applications must be signed by the licensee in the case of
- 16 the individual or by a member of the corporation, company, or
- 17 organization.
- 18 (mm) "Water delivery service" means a service that delivers
- 19 drinking water to a child care center that meets the standards of
- 20 the safe drinking water act, 42 USC 300f to 300j-25.
- 21 (2) A family child care home or group child care home is
- 22 automatically eligible for increased capacity after satisfying all
- 23 of the following criteria:
- 24 (a) Holds a current license.
- 25 (b) Has been licensed to operate for at least 29 consecutive
- 26 months.
- (c) Has received 1 or more unrelated minor children for care
- 28 and supervision during the licensed period under subdivision (b).
- 29 (d) Has received a renewed regular license after at least 29

- 1 months of licensed operation under subdivision (b).
- 2 (3) The department may rescind increased capacity due to 1 or 3 more of the following:
  - (a) Corrective action.
- 5 (b) Licensing action.

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- 6 (c) Determination by the department that increased capacity is 7 not conducive to the welfare of children as that term is defined in 8 section 5m.
- 9 (4) If the department rescinds increased capacity as outlined 10 in subsection (3), the family child care home or group child care 11 home may be considered for increased capacity not less than 22 12 months after rescinding increased capacity in a form and manner 13 determined by the department.
- 14 (5) A family child care home or group child care home may
  15 appeal rescission of increased capacity under a hearing held in the
  16 manner provided under section 11(2).
  - Sec. 3i. (1) Within 1 year after the effective date of the amendatory act that added this section, each child care center shall develop a drinking water management plan. On request, the child care center shall make the plan available to the department of licensing and regulatory affairs, a staff member, or a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the child care center. The plan must specify all of the following by category:
  - (a) Locations where water outlets will be maintained to deliver water for human consumption, whether as drinking water or a component of a food or beverage, using the following categories:
- 27 (i) Locations where filtered bottle-filling stations will be 28 maintained, if applicable.
  - (ii) Locations where filtered faucets will be maintained, if

- 1 applicable.
- 2 (iii) Locations where filtered pitchers will be maintained, if 3 applicable.
- 4 (iv) Locations where unfiltered drinking fountains or
  5 unfiltered faucets will be maintained, subject to section 3j(a).
- 6 (v) Locations where drinking water from a water delivery
  7 service will be maintained, if applicable.
- 8 (b) Locations where water outlets will be maintained for 9 purposes other than to deliver water for human consumption, if 10 applicable.
- 11 (c) Locations where water outlets will be shut off or rendered 12 permanently inoperable, if applicable.
- 13 (d) Regular replacement of the filter cartridge for each
  14 filtered bottle-filling station, filtered faucet, and filtered
  15 pitcher in compliance with manufacturer instructions or
  16 recommendations of the department of environment, Great Lakes, and
  17 energy.
- 18 (2) Each child care center shall review and update the
  19 drinking water management plan created under subsection (1) at
  20 least once every 5 years and make changes as needed or as directed
  21 by the department of licensing and regulatory affairs.
- 22 (3) A local health department or the department of licensing 23 and regulatory affairs shall conduct a water inspection at each 24 child care center at least once every 2 years. As part of the water 25 inspection, the local health department or the department of 26 licensing and regulatory affairs shall test water collected from 27 all filtered bottle-filling stations and filtered faucets. If the 28 water testing under this subsection indicates the presence of lead 29 at a concentration of more than 5 parts per billion, the local

- 1 health department or the department of licensing and regulatory
- 2 affairs shall alert the department of environment, Great Lakes, and
- 3 energy. Within 30 days after providing notice under this
- 4 subsection, the child care center shall develop a remediation plan
- 5 and incorporate the remediation plan into the drinking water
- 6 management plan under subsection (1). The child care center shall
- 7 collect the water for sampling under this subsection. Water
- 8 collected for sampling under this subsection must be drawn from all
- 9 of the bubblers of the filtered bottle-filling stations and
- 10 filtered faucets and must be collected in 250-milliliter bottles
- 11 after at least an 8-hour stagnation period and before any water use
- 12 occurs at the child care center. The local health department or
- 13 department of licensing and regulatory affairs shall provide the
- 14 child care center with a sufficient number of 250-milliliter
- 15 bottles before the water is collected under this subsection. After
- 16 the child care center collects the water samples, the local health
- 17 department or department of licensing and regulatory affairs shall
- 18 collect all of the 250-milliliter bottles and conduct the testing
- 19 described under this subsection. As used in this subsection, "local
- 20 health department" means that term as defined in section 1105 of
- 21 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.1105, and having those
- 22 powers and duties described under part 24 of the public health
- 23 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2401 to 333.2498.
- 24 (4) If, on a continual basis, a health inspection conducted
- 25 under subsection (3) delays the department of licensing and
- 26 regulatory affairs from issuing or denying a license for a child
- 27 care center under this act, the department of licensing and
- 28 regulatory affairs may complete the water inspection instead of the
- 29 local health department.

- 1 (5) A child care center that installs a filtered bottle-
- 2 filling station, filtered faucet, filtered pitcher, or other
- 3 filtered source shall install, operate, and maintain them in
- 4 accordance with manufacturer instructions or recommendations of the
- 5 department of environment, Great Lakes, and energy.
- 6 (6) A child care center shall retain the following documents
- 7 for 3 years or until after a health inspection occurs under
- 8 subsection (3), whichever is sooner, and make the documents
