## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4815**

June 15, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Kunse, Neyer, BeGole, Beson, Rigas and Mueller and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1943 PA 240, entitled "State employees' retirement act,"

by amending section 68c (MCL 38.68c), as amended by 2022 PA 217.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 68c. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 2 subsection (3), a retirant who is receiving a retirement allowance
- 3 under this act and is employed by this state beginning after
- 4 October 1, 2007—the effective date of the 2023 amendatory act that
- 5 amended this sentence agrees to forfeit his or her right to receive
- 6 that retirement allowance during this period of state employment.

- 1 The retirement system shall stop payment of the retirement 2 allowance to a retirant described in this subsection during this period of state employment and shall reinstate payment of the 3 retirement allowance without recalculation when the period of state 4 5 employment ceases. This subsection does not apply to a retirant who 6 is directly or indirectly employed by this state on October 1, 2007 7 while he or she remains in the position held by the retirant on 8 October 1, 2007. As used in this subsection, "employed by this 9 state" means employed directly by this state as an employee, 10 indirectly by this state through a contractual arrangement with 11 other parties, or by engagement of the retirant by this state as an 12 independent contractor. This subsection does not apply to a 13 retirant who is engaged as an independent contractor on October 1, 14 2010 while the retirant remains engaged in the same contract that
- 17 (2) A hospital, medical-surgical, and or sick care benefits
  18 plan, dental plan, vision plan, and hearing plan that covers
  19 retirants, retirant allowance beneficiaries, former qualified
  20 participants, and health benefit dependents under this act must
  21 contain a coordination of benefits provision that provides all of
  22 the following:

was held by the retirant on October 1, 2010 without amendment or

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- (a) If the person covered under any of the plans is also eligible for Medicare, the benefits under Medicare must be determined before the health insurance benefits under this act.

- (b) The retirant is hired in a position that is limited in term, no benefits are paid, and pay is on a per diem basis.
  - (c) The department of corrections provides written notice to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget that attempts have been made to fill the position through postings and recruitment and that the position vacancy still exists.
    - (d) The department of corrections reports the employment of a retirant under this subsection within 30 days of employment of the retirant to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget. The report must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the retirant is employed, and the total compensation paid to the retirant.
- 25 (e) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination.
  - (4) Subsection (1) does not apply to the appointment of a retirant who retired after a bona fide termination and who was an assistant attorney general as a special assistant attorney general if the attorney general determines that, as a result of his or her

18	retirant as a witness, expert, or consultant for litigation
19	involving this state. The contract must provide that the retirant's
20	service as a witness, expert, or consultant ends at the conclusion
21	of the litigation.
22	(b) The attorney general determines that, as a result of the
23	retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant
24	possesses specialized expertise and experience necessary for the
25	litigation and the contract is the most cost-effective option for
26	the state.
27	(c) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination of
28	employment.
29	(7) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the

1 following apply: 2 (a) The retirant is hired by the department of natural 3 resources for active wildland fire suppression. 4 (b) There is an immediate continual need for pregualified, 5 skilled, and trained personnel to address wildfire suppression. 6 (c) The retirant works no more than 600 hours in a fiscal 7 <del>vear.</del> 8 (d) The retirant is hired in a position that is limited in 9 term, no benefits are paid, and the pay is not more than 70% of the 10 maximum hourly wage granted to classified civil service employees 11 employed by the department of natural resources to perform the same 12 duties as the retirant for the fiscal year during which the 13 retirant is employed. 14 (e) The department of natural resources reports the employment 15 of a retirant under this subsection within 30 days after employment 16 and within 30 days after termination of employment or within 30 17 days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, to the state budget office and the department of technology, 18 19 management, and budget. The report required under this subdivision 20 must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the 21 retirant is employed, the equivalent civil service position in 22 which the retirant is employed, the hourly wage paid to the retirant, and the total hours of service provided by the retirant 23 24 for the fiscal year. The department of natural resources may submit 25 a report required under this subdivision electronically. 26 (f) By March 1 of each year, the department of natural resources submits a summary of all the reports required under 27 subdivision (e) for the preceding fiscal year to the house of 28

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representatives and senate appropriations subcommittees that

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- consider the budget of the department of natural resources, the 1 2 state budget office, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the department of technology, management, and budget. The department of 3 natural resources may submit a summary required under this 4 5 subdivision electronically. 6 (8) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the 7 following apply: 8 (a) The retirant is employed by the legislative service bureau 9 as legal counsel through a contractual arrangement. 10 (b) The legislative council administrator determines that, as 11 a result of the retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant possesses specialized expertise and experience necessary 12 for the hiring of the retirant and that the hiring of the retirant 13 14 is the most cost-effective option for this state. 15 (c) The legislative service bureau reports the employment of a 16 retirant under this subsection within 30 days after employment and 17 within 30 days after termination of employment to the department of technology, management, and budget, office of retirement services. 18 19 The legislative service bureau may submit a report required under

employment and within 30 days after termination of employment or
within 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs

(10) Until September 30, 2023, subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the following apply:

(a) The department of health and human services hires the retirant as a mental health professional other than a psychiatrist

to provide mental health services to individuals in psychiatric hospitals operated by the department of health and human services.

 (b) The retirant retired before October 1, 2015 and after a bona fide termination of employment.

(c) The department of health and human services determines that, as a result of the retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant possesses specialized expertise and experience necessary for the hiring of the retirant and that the hiring of the retirant is the most cost-effective option for this state.

(d) The department of health and human services reports the employment of a retirant under this subsection within 30 days after employment and within 30 days after termination of employment or within 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget. The report required under this subdivision must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the retirant is employed, the equivalent civil service position in which the retirant is employed, the hourly wage paid to the retirant, and the total hours of service provided by the retirant for the fiscal year. The department of health and human services may submit a report required under this subdivision electronically.

(e) By March 1 of each year, the department of health and human services submits a summary of all the reports required under subdivision (d) for the preceding fiscal year to the house of representatives and senate appropriations subcommittees that consider the budget of the department of health and human services, the state budget office, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the department of technology, management, and budget. The department of health and human services may submit a summary

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required under this subdivision electronically.
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          (11) Until March 31, 2021, subsection (1) does not apply to a
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    retirant if all of the following apply:
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         (a) The Michigan unemployment insurance agency hires the
    retirant after March 15, 2020.
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          (b) The department of labor and economic opportunity
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    determines that, as a result of the retirant's previous employment
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    with this state, the retirant possesses specialized expertise and
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    experience necessary for the hiring of the retirant and that the
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    hiring of the retirant is the most cost-effective option for this
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    state.
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          (c) The department of labor and economic opportunity reports
    the employment of the retirant under this subsection within 30 days
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    after employment or by November 19, 2020, whichever occurs first,
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    and within 30 days after termination of employment or within 30
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    days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, to
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    the state budget office and the department of technology,
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    management, and budget. The report required under this subdivision
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    must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the
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    retirant is employed, the equivalent civil service position in
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    which the retirant is employed, the hourly wage paid to the
    retirant, and the total hours of service provided by the retirant
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    for the fiscal year. The department of labor and economic
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    opportunity may submit a report required under this subdivision
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    electronically.
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         (12) Until October 21, 2020, subsection (1) does not apply to
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    a retirant if all of the following apply:
          (a) The Michigan occupational safety and health administration
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    hires the retirant after March 15, 2020.
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(b) The Michigan occupational safety and health administration 1 2 determines that, as a result of the retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant possesses specialized expertise and 3 experience necessary for the hiring of the retirant and that the 4 5 hiring of the retirant is the most cost-effective option for this 6 state. 7 (c) The Michigan occupational safety and health administration 8 reports the employment of the retirant under this subsection within 9 30 days after employment or by November 19, 2020, whichever occurs 10 first, and within 30 days after termination of employment or within 11 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, 12 to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget. The report required under this subdivision 13 must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the 14 15 retirant is employed, the equivalent civil service position in 16 which the retirant is employed, the hourly wage paid to the 17 retirant, and the total hours of service provided by the retirant 18 for the fiscal year. The Michigan occupational safety and health 19 administration may submit a report required under this subdivision 20 electronically. 21 (13) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the

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28 29 (a) The retirant retired from the department of corrections.

(b) The retirant is hired indirectly by this state through a contractual arrangement with another party providing telecommunications services to the department of corrections for the primary purpose of collecting or analyzing intelligence generated within the department of corrections.

(c) The retirant has been retired for at least 30 days.

1	(d) The department of corrections determines that, as a result
2	of the retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant
3	possesses specialized expertise and experience necessary for the
4	hiring of the retirant to complete the tasks under subdivision (b).
5	(e) The department of corrections reports the employment of a
6	retirant under this subsection within 30 days after employment and
7	within 30 days after termination of employment or within 30 days
8	after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, to the
9	state budget office and the office of retirement services. The
10	report required under this subdivision must include the name of the
11	retirant and the capacity in which the retirant is employed. The
12	department of corrections may submit a report required under this
13	subdivision electronically.
14	(f) The department of corrections determines that either of

28	(c) "Psychiatric hospital" means that term as defined in

- 3 (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the 4 following apply:
- 5 (a) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination.

- 6 (b) The retirant has been retired for at least 6 consecutive
  7 months before becoming employed by this state under this
  8 subsection, unless 1 of the following applies:
  - (i) The retirant's retirement allowance effective date is before the effective date of the amendatory act that added this subparagraph.
  - (ii) The department of attorney general contracts with the retirant as a witness, expert, or consultant for litigation involving this state. The contract must provide that the retirant's service as a witness, expert, or consultant ends at the conclusion of the litigation.
  - (iii) The retirant is employed by this state to respond to a declared state of emergency or state of disaster as described in section 3 of the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.403. The duration of the employment must terminate not more than 90 days after the end of the declared state of emergency or state of disaster.
    - (c) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or compensation attributable to the employment described in this subsection for a recalculation of his or her retirement allowance.

  27 applicable, reports the employment of the retirant under this
  28 subsection within 30 days after employment and reports any
  29 termination of employment within 30 days after the termination to

- 1 the office of retirement services. A report required under this
