## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5298**

November 03, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Hoadley, Outman, Cavitt, Markkanen, Bierlein, Kunse, DeBoyer, Schuette, Borton, Friske, Jaime Greene and Bruck and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 40102 (MCL 324.40102), as amended by 2015 PA 24.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 40102. (1) "Animals" means wild birds and wild mammals.
- 2 (2) "Bag limit" means the number of animals that may be taken3 and possessed as determined by the department.
- 4 (3) "Bow" means a device for propelling an arrow from a string 5 drawn, held, and released by hand where the force used to hold the 6 string in the drawn position is provided by the archer's muscles.

- (4) "Buy" or "sell" means an exchange or attempt or offer to
   exchange for money, barter, or anything of value.
- 3 (5) "Chase" means to follow animals with dogs or other wild or4 domestic animals trained for that purpose.
- (6) "Cormorant damage" means adverse impacts of double-crested
  cormorants on fish, fish hatchery stock, wildlife, plants, and
  their habitats and on man-made structures.
- 8 (7) "Cormorant depredation order" means the depredation order
  9 for double-crested cormorants to protect public resources, 50 CFR
  10 21.48, issued by the United States Department of the Interior, Fish
  11 and Wildlife Service.
- 12 (8) "Crossbow" means a weapon consisting of a bow mounted
  13 transversely on a stock or frame and designed to fire an arrow,
  14 bolt, or quarrel by the release of a bow string that is controlled
  15 by a mechanical or electric trigger and has a working safety and a
  16 draw weight of 100 pounds or greater.
- 17 (9) "Deer or elk baiting" means the depositing, distributing,
  18 or tending of feed in an area frequented by wild, free-ranging
  19 white-tailed deer or elk to aid in the taking of deer or elk. Deer
  20 or elk baiting does not include any of the following:
- 21 (a) Feeding wild birds or other wildlife if done in such a 22 manner as to exclude wild, free-ranging white-tailed deer and elk 23 from gaining access to the feed.
- 24 (b) The scattering of feed solely as the result of normal 25 logging practices or normal agricultural practices.
- 26 (c) The storage or use of feed for agricultural purposes if 1
  27 or more of the following apply:
- 28 (i) The area is occupied by livestock actively consuming the 29 feed on a daily basis.

- 1 (ii) The feed is covered to deter wild, free-ranging white-2 tailed deer or elk from gaining access to the feed.
- 3 (iii) The feed is in a storage facility that is consistent with 4 normal agricultural practices.
- 5 (10) (9) "Deer or elk feeding" means the depositing,
- 6 distributing, or tending of feed in an area frequented by wild,
- 7 free-ranging white-tailed deer or elk. Deer or elk feeding does not
- 8 include any of the following:
- 9 (a) Feeding wild birds or other wildlife if done in such a
- 10 manner as to exclude wild, free-ranging white-tailed deer and elk
- 11 from gaining access to the feed.
- 12 (b) The scattering of feed solely as the result of normal

- 24 (11) (10) "Disability" means a determinable physical
- 25 characteristic of an individual that may result from disease,
- 26 injury, congenital condition of birth, or functional disorder.
- 27 (12) (11) "Feed" means a substance composed of grain, mineral,
- 28 salt, fruit, vegetable, hay, or any other food material or
- 29 combination of these materials, whether natural or manufactured,

- that may attract white-tailed deer or elk. Feed does not include
  any of the following:
- 3 (a) Plantings for wildlife.
- 4 (b) Standing farm crops under normal agricultural practices.
- 5 (c) Agricultural commodities scattered solely as the result of6 normal agricultural practices.
- 7 (13) (12) "Firearm" means any weapon which will, is designed
- 8 to, or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by action of
- 9 an explosive. A pneumatic qun, as that term is defined in section 1
- 10 of 1990 PA 319, MCL 123.1101, other than a paintball gun that
- 11 expels by pneumatic pressure plastic balls filled with paint for
- 12 the purpose of marking the point of impact, is also considered a
- 13 firearm for the purpose of this act.
- 14 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 15 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5299 (request no.
- 16 04654'23) of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into law.
