A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

(MCL 339.101 to 339.2677) by adding section 212a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 212a. (1) Beginning January 1, 2025, and by May 1 of each
- 2 subsequent year, the department shall review the process for
- 3 licensure or registration of 25% of occupations and submit a report
- 4 to the members of the senate and house of representatives that
- 5 contains all of the following:

- 1 (a) A recommendation on whether the process for licensure or 2 registration should be modified or remain the same.
- 3 (b) A recommendation on whether the issuance of a license or 4 registration for an occupation is necessary, outdated, or 5 duplicative.
- 6 (c) A recommendation on whether the issuance of a license or registration for an occupation should be eliminated.
- 8 (d) The fiscal impact of the process for licensure or9 registration on the department.
- 10 (e) The fiscal impact of the issuance of a license or
  11 registration for an occupation on a person, including, but not
  12 limited to, if the issuance has a disproportionate impact on a
  13 business of a certain size, industry, or geographic area of this
  14 state.
- (f) Whether the issuance of a license or registration for an occupation has caused wage loss, job loss, or a restriction on a job in a high-need field in this state. As used in this subdivision, "high-need field" means an essential industry as identified through the futures for frontliners program operated by the department of labor and economic opportunity.
- 21 (2) The department shall review all of the occupations by not 22 later than May 1, 2028.
