SENATE BILL NO. 720

February 14, 2024, Introduced by Senators SINGH, DAMOOSE, SHINK and BAYER and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1966 PA 313, entitled

"An act to award tuition grants to resident students enrolled in independent nonprofit institutions of higher learning; and to make an appropriation therefor,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 (MCL 390.991, 390.992, 390.993, 390.994, 390.995, and 390.996), the title and sections 1, 4, 5, and 6 as amended by 1980 PA 503 and section 3 as amended by 2021 PA 41.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

2 An act to award tuition grants to resident students enrolled

- 1 in independent nonprofit institutions of higher learning and

- 5 Sec. 1. Tuition grants are established by the this state to
- 6 foster the pursuit of higher education by resident students
- 7 enrolled in eligible educational institutions. As used in this act,
- 8 "eligible educational institution" means an institution that meets
- 9 all of the following:
- 10 (a) Is 1 of the following:
- 11 (i) An independent nonprofit colleges college or universities
- 12 university in the this state. , which have
- 13 (ii) A nonprofit institution in this state that provides
- 14 career-oriented skilled trades instruction in maritime trades and
- 15 is nationally accredited and approved for federal financial aid.
- (b) Has filed with the board of education a certificate of
- 17 assurance of compliance with title 6 of the civil rights act of
- 18 1964, Public Law 88-352, 77 Stat. 241, as in effect on January 1,
- **19** 1966. , whose
- 20 (c) Has instructional programs that are not comprised solely
- 21 of sectarian instruction or religious worship. 7 and which are
- 22 (d) Is approved by the state board of education.
- 23 Sec. 2. (1) The Michigan higher education assistance authority
- 24 created by Act No. 77 of the Public Acts of 1960, as amended, being
- 25 sections 390.951 to 390.961 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall
- 26 administer the grants awarded under this act, which shall must be
- 27 available to each eligible resident student registered as an
- 28 eligible undergraduate or graduate student in an eligible
- 29 educational institution described in section 1(a)(i) or as an

- 1 eligible student in an eligible educational institution described
- 2 in section 1(a) (\ddot{u}). Priority shall be given The authority shall
- 3 give priority to full-time students.
- 4 (2) As used in this act, "Michigan higher education assistance
- 5 authority" or "authority" means the Michigan higher education
- 6 assistance authority created in 1960 PA 77, MCL 390.951 to 390.961,
- 7 or its successor.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) Upon application of an eligible resident student
- **9** who has resided in this state continuously for the preceding 12
- 10 months, is not considered a resident of any other state, is not
- 11 incarcerated in a corrections institution, and is registered in an
- 12 independent nonprofit college or university in this state, as
- 13 described in section 1, eligible educational institution, the
- 14 Michigan higher education assistance authority shall grant an
- 15 amount as provided for in this act for each semester of attendance.
- 16 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a student is not
- 17 eligible for a grant for tuition and fees for more than 10
- 18 semesters of undergraduate or skilled trades education, or its
- 19 equivalent in trimesters, or its equivalent as determined by the
- 20 authority for less than full-time students; for more than 6
- 21 semesters of graduate education, or its equivalent in trimesters;
- 22 or for more than 8 semesters in dental education, or its equivalent
- 23 in trimesters. A student enrolled as an undergraduate during the
- 24 2020 spring term and the 2020-2021 academic year is eligible for a
- 25 grant of tuition and fees for up to 12 semesters of undergraduate
- 26 education, or its equivalent in trimesters, or its equivalent as
- 27 determined by the authority for less than full-time students.
- 28 (2) A student must maintain satisfactory academic progress, as
- 29 defined by the college or university eligible educational

- institution in which the student is enrolled, to remain eligible
 for the tuition grant under this act.
- 3 (3) If a student possessing a degree, certificate, or
- 4 credential at a given academic level enrolls for a second degree,
- 5 certificate, or credential at the same academic level, the
- 6 authority shall include tuition grants received by the student when
- 7 enrolled for the previous degree, certificate, or credential at the
- 8 same level in determining the student's eligibility under
- 9 subsection (1).
- 10 Sec. 4. (1) The Michigan higher education assistance authority
- 11 shall determine the amount of the grant to be paid for each
- 12 semester or trimester shall be determined by the Michigan higher
- 13 education assistance authority based upon on an evaluation of the
- 14 family's financial resources. In determining financial resources,
- 15 the authority shall use the same criteria as are used in Act No.
- 16 208 of the Public Acts of 1964, as amended, being sections 390.971
- 17 to 390.981 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. under 1964 PA 208, MCL
- 18 390.971 to 390.981. The evaluation shall must make allowance for
- 19 other members of the applicant's family enrolled in an approved
- 20 institution of higher education.eligible educational institutions.
- 21 (2) A grant shall must not be made under this act to a student
- 22 who is enrolled in a program of study leading to a degree in
- 23 theology, divinity, or religious education.
- 24 (3) Prorated payments shall must be made at the beginning of
- 25 each semester or term to the student or to the college or
- 26 university eliqible educational institution for credit to the
- 27 student's account.
- Sec. 5. Each tuition grant shall must not exceed the amount of
- 29 tuition and fees for the full academic year as reported by the

- 1 college or university eligible educational institution in which the
- 2 applicant is enrolled, or an amount the Michigan higher education
- 3 assistance authority finds appropriate in relation to the family's
- 4 financial resources, whichever is the lesser. If there are not
- 5 sufficient appropriated funds to provide each student with the
- 6 grant amount for which the student is eligible, the Michigan higher
- 7 education assistance authority shall establish a maximum grant
- 8 level for that academic year.
- 9 Sec. 6. The Michigan higher education assistance authority
- 10 shall promulgate rules to carry out implement this act pursuant to
- 11 Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as amended, being sections
- 12 24.201 to 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.under the
- 13 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 14 24.328.
