

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 31

Reps. Bierlein, Alexander, BeGole, Tyrone Carter, Glanville, Haadsma, Hood, Hope, Hoskins, Rheingans, Rogers, Schuette and Wilson offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to declare February 7-14, 2023, as Congenital
2 Heart Defect Awareness Week in the state of Michigan.

3 Whereas, Congenital heart defect (CHD) is the number 1 birth
4 defect. Forty-thousand infants are born in the United States each
5 year with a congenital heart defect. Infant deaths due to CHD often
6 occur during the neonatal period when the baby is less than 28 days
7 old. About 25 percent of children born with critical CHD need heart
8 surgery or other interventions to survive. Ninety-seven percent of
9 babies born with non-critical CHD are expected to survive to one
10 year of age and about 95 percent of babies born with a non-critical

1 CHD are expected to survive to 18 years of age; and

2 Whereas, There are an estimated 2-3 million people living with
3 congenital heart defect. In the United States, hospital costs for
4 the population of individuals with cardiovascular defects in 2013
5 were about \$6.1 billion. Pediatric hospitalizations with CHDs
6 accounted for approximately \$5.6 billion in hospital costs,
7 representing 15.1% of costs for all pediatric hospitalizations in
8 2009. At least 15% of CHDs are associated with genetic conditions
9 and about 20% to 30% of people with a CHD have other physical
10 problems or developmental or cognitive disorders; and

11 Whereas, There is no cure for CHD. However, more and more
12 children are surviving thanks to advances in medical research; now,
13 therefore, be it

14 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
15 this legislative body declare February 7-14, 2023, as Congenital
16 Heart Defect Awareness Week in the state of Michigan. We urge all
17 citizens to show their support and help raise awareness in the
18 fight against congenital heart defects.
