

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 89

1 A resolution to declare April 2023 as Sexual Assault Awareness
2 Month in the state of Michigan.

3 Whereas, Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the
4 fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts women,
5 children, and men of all racial, cultural, and economic
6 backgrounds; and

1 Whereas, The term sexual assault refers to sexual contact or
2 behavior that occurs without explicit consent of the victim; and

3 Whereas, According to the National Sexual Violence Resource
4 Center, one out of every five American women has been the victim of
5 an attempted or completed rape in her lifetime and approximately
6 2.6 percent of American men have experienced an attempted or
7 completed rape in their lifetime; and

8 Whereas, Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to
9 confront the reality. From 2009-2013, child protective services
10 agencies substantiated, or found strong evidence to indicate that,
11 63,000 children a year were victims of sexual abuse and a majority
12 of child victims are ages 12-17. Of victims under the age of 18, 34
13 percent of victims of sexual assault and rape are under age 12; and

14 Whereas, Michigan State Police statistics indicate that there
15 were 6,823 incidents of rape that were reported to law enforcement
16 in 2019; and

17 Whereas, Sexual violence can deeply and enduringly impact
18 survivors on psychological, emotional, and social levels. Ninety-
19 four percent of women who are raped experience posttraumatic stress
20 disorder (PTSD) symptoms during the two weeks following the rape
21 and approximately 70 percent of rape or sexual assault victims
22 experience moderate to severe distress, a larger percentage than
23 for any other violent crime studied in the National Crime
24 Victimization Survey by the Bureau of Justice Statistics. Access to
25 informed and supportive services can greatly increase survivors'
26 ability to heal from sexual assault; and

27 Whereas, Sexual violence is an intolerable violent crime with
28 public health implications for every person in Michigan. Our state
29 and individual communities must be committed to hold sexual assault

1 perpetrators accountable for their heinous crimes; and

2 Whereas, When we actively increase education, awareness, and
3 community involvement, we can help prevent sexual violence and
4 create a safer environment for everyone. We must work together to
5 educate our entire population about what can be done to prevent
6 sexual assault, support survivors, and ensure that survivors are
7 not re-victimized; now, therefore, be it

8 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
9 this legislative body declare April 2023 as Sexual Assault
10 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We strongly support the
11 efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every
12 citizen to actively engage in public and private efforts to prevent
13 sexual violence and will take appropriate action and support one
14 another to create a safer environment for all.
