- 10 sightings of the crescent moon. Ramadan continues until the evening

- 1 of Tuesday, April 9, 2024, with Eid al-Fitr, the celebration of the
- 2 completion of the month; and
- 3 Whereas, Muslims in Michigan, our nation, and around the world
- 4 will observe Ramadan by fasting, emphasizing self-discipline,
- 5 worship, charity, and reading the holy Quran to improve patience,
- 6 humility, and spirituality; and
- 7 Whereas, During Ramadan, Muslims spend this period in
- 8 reflection and prayer while strengthening the bonds of family,
- 9 friendship, and community. Ramadan is considered the most sacred
- 10 month of the Islamic calendar; and
- 11 Whereas, The Muslim population has been growing in the United
- 12 States and today's Muslim American population is a tapestry of
- 13 ethnic, racial, linguistic, social, and economic groups; and
- 14 Whereas, One of the largest populations of Muslims in the
- 15 United States resides in Michigan and makes meaningful
- 16 contributions to our state; now, therefore, be it
- 17 Resolved by House of Representatives, That the members of this
- 18 legislative body extend best wishes to Muslims in Michigan, the
- 19 United States, and worldwide, for a joyous and meaningful
- 20 observance of Ramadan, a holy month of prayer, fasting, charity,
