A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding sections 17019 and 17519.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 17019. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection
- 2 (2), a physician shall not knowingly do any of the following:
- 3 (a) Perform gender reassignment surgery on a minor.
- 4 (b) Prescribe a cross-sex hormone or puberty-blocking drug for
- 5 a minor with the intent to assist the minor with gender transition.
- 6 (2) A physician may continue to prescribe a cross-sex hormone

- 1 or puberty-blocking drug for a minor if the minor has been a
- 2 resident of this state since the effective date of the amendatory
- 3 act that added this section and the physician has done both of the
- 4 following:
- 5 (a) Initiated a course of treatment for the minor before the
- 6 effective date of the amendatory act that added this section that
- 7 includes the prescription of a cross-sex hormone or puberty-
- 8 blocking drug prohibited under subsection (1).
- 9 (b) Determined and documented in the minor's medical record
- 10 that terminating the minor's prescription for the cross-sex hormone
- 11 or puberty-blocking drug would cause harm to the minor.
- 12 (3) As used in this section:
- 13 (a) "Biological sex" means the biological indication of male
- 14 and female, including sex chromosomes, naturally occurring sex
- 15 hormones, gonads, and nonambiguous internal and external genitalia
- 16 present at birth, without regard to an individual's psychological,
- 17 chosen, or subjective experience of gender.
- 18 (b) "Cross-sex hormone" means testosterone, estrogen, or
- 19 progesterone given to a minor in an amount greater than would
- 20 normally be produced endogenously in a healthy individual of the
- 21 minor's age and biological sex.
- (c) "Gender reassignment surgery" means a surgery performed
- 23 for the purpose of assisting an individual with gender transition
- 24 that seeks to surgically alter or remove a healthy physical or
- 25 anatomical characteristic or feature that is typical for the
- 26 individual's biological sex, in order to instill or create a
- 27 physiological or anatomical characteristic that resembles a sex
- 28 different from the individual's biological sex. Gender reassignment
- 29 surgery includes genital gender reassignment surgery and nongenital

- 1 gender reassignment surgery.
- 2 (d) "Gender transition" means the process in which an
- 3 individual goes from identifying with and living as a gender that
- 4 corresponds to the individual's biological sex to identifying with
- 5 and living as a gender different from the individual's biological
- 6 sex, including a social, legal, or physical change.
- 7 (e) "Genital gender reassignment surgery" means surgery
- 8 performed for the purpose of assisting an individual with gender
- 9 transition and includes both of the following:
- 10 (i) Surgery that sterilizes, including, but not limited to, a
- 11 castration, vasectomy, hysterectomy, oophorectomy, orchiectomy, and
- 12 penectomy.
- 13 (ii) Surgery that artificially constructs tissue with the
- 14 appearance of genitalia that differs from the individual's
- 15 biological sex, including, but not limited to, metoidiplasty,
- 16 phalloplasty, and vaginoplasty.
- 17 (f) "Nongenital gender reassignment surgery" means surgery
- 18 performed for the purpose of assisting an individual with gender
- 19 transition such as augmentation mammoplasty, facial feminization
- 20 surgery, liposuction, lipofilling, voice surgery, thyroid cartilage
- 21 reduction, gluteal augmentation, pectoral implants, or any other
- 22 aesthetic procedure.
- 23 (g) "Puberty-blocking drug" means a gonadotropin-releasing
- 24 hormone analog or other synthetic drug used to stop luteinizing
- 25 hormone and follicle stimulating hormone secretion, a synthetic
- 26 antiandrogen drug used to block the androgen receptor, or any other
- 27 drug used to delay or suppress normal puberty.
