A bill to amend 2008 PA 23, entitled

"Enhanced driver license and enhanced official state personal identification card act,"

by amending section 5 (MCL 28.305), as amended by 2023 PA 262.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) An applicant who chooses to apply for an enhanced 2 driver license or enhanced official state personal identification
- ${f 3}$ card shall provide all of the following items to the secretary of
- 4 state in the manner prescribed by the secretary of state:
- 5 (a) A completed application indicating that indicates the
- 6 applicant's full legal name, any legal name change resulting from

- 1 the applicant's adoption, marriage, divorce, or a court order, date
- 2 of birth, residence address, height, gender, eye color, Social
- 3 Security number, signature, and, if applicable, the applicant's
- 4 intention to be an organ donor as provided under section 307 of the
- 5 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.307, or section 2 of
- 6 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.292.
- 7 (b) Documentation demonstrating the applicant's United States
- 8 citizenship, full legal name, any legal name change resulting from
- 9 the applicant's adoption, marriage, divorce, or a court order, date
- 10 of birth, residence address, and Social Security number.
- 11 (c) The applicant's signed certification that the information
- 12 presented by the applicant is true and correct to the best of the
- 13 applicant's knowledge.
- 14 (d) The fee prescribed under section 6.
- 15 (2) An applicant who applies for an enhanced driver license or
- 16 enhanced official state personal identification card shall have the
- 17 applicant's facial image and signature captured or reproduced by
- 18 the secretary of state at the time of application. An individual's
- 19 facial image or signature may be made available by this state and
- 20 used as follows:
- 21 (a) By a federal, state, or local government agency for any
- 22 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- 23 (b) By another state to the extent required by federal law.
- 24 (c) By the secretary of state for any purpose specifically
- 25 authorized by law.
- 26 (d) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
- 27 of state police for use as provided in section 5c of 1927 PA 372,
- **28** MCL 28.425c.
- 29 (e) For any other purpose as determined by the secretary of

- 1 state, if an individual provides the individual's written
 2 authorization for the release of the individual's own facial image
 3 or signature.
 - (f) As otherwise required by law.

- 5 (3) Except as otherwise provided under subsection (2), the
 6 secretary of state shall not disclose an individual's facial image,
 7 signature, Social Security number, or copies or digital images of
 8 documents retained under this act.
 - (4) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal identification card issued under this act must not display an individual's Social Security number or, if applicable, a communication impediment designation on the face of the card.
- 13 (5) The secretary of state shall examine and verify the 14 genuineness, regularity, and legality of every application and 15 other documentation submitted to the secretary of state for an 16 enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal 17 identification card, and may in all cases investigate as the 18 secretary of state considers necessary or require additional information, and shall reject any application if not satisfied of 19 20 the genuineness, regularity, and legality of the application or supporting documentation or the truth of any statement contained in 21 the application or supporting documentation, or for any other 22 23 reason authorized by law. A decision by the secretary of state to reject an application under this subsection may be appealed under 24 25 section 631 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 26 600.631.
- (6) The secretary of state shall retain copies or digital
 images of documents provided by the applicant to the secretary of
 state under this act.

- 1 (7) The facial image of an applicant for a an enhanced driver
 2 license or enhanced official personal identification card under
 3 this act who was not issued an enhanced driver license or enhanced
 4 official state personal identification card must be retained for
 5 not less than 1 year, unless fraud is suspected, in which case a
- 6 record containing the applicant's facial image and the reason for7 denial must be retained for not less than 10 years.
- 8 (8) The secretary of state may disclose digital images of 9 documents retained under this act to a federal, state, or local 10 government agency for any law enforcement purpose authorized by 11 law. Except as otherwise provided in this act, copies or digital 12 images of documents retained under this act are exempt from 13 disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 15 (9) The secretary of state shall not compile or maintain a
 16 database under this act that may be shared with a country other
 17 than the United States.
- 18 (10) The secretary of state shall, as provided under section 310 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310, and 19 20 under section 1 of 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291, allow an applicant for an enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal 21 22 identification card, as applicable, to elect a communication 23 impediment designation and implement the process to allow an 24 individual with authorized access to the law enforcement 25 information network under the C.J.I.S. policy council act, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.215, to view a communication impediment 26 27 designation that the holder of an enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal identification card has 28

voluntarily provided to the secretary of state. The secretary of

- 1 state may cancel or revoke a communication impediment designation
- 2 elected and maintained under this section for the circumstances
- 3 described under in section 310(23) of the Michigan vehicle code,
- 4 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310, and under in section 1(16) 1(14) of 1972
- 5 PA 222, MCL 28.291. The secretary of state shall provide the holder
- 6 of an enhanced driver license or an enhanced official state
- 7 personal identification card notice and an opportunity to be heard
- 8 before canceling or revoking a communication impediment designation
- 9 under this section.
- 10 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 11 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 12 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- unless Senate Bill No. (request no. S01814'25) or House Bill
- 14 No. 4194 (request no. H01814'25) of the 103rd Legislature is
- 15 enacted into law.
