

HOUSE BILL NO. 4249

March 18, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Snyder, Greene, McFall, Mentzer, MacDonell, Martus, Morgan, O'Neal, Rheingans, Glanville, Weiss, Herzberg, Green, B. Carter, Markkanen, Bohnak, Frisbie, Outman, Kunse, Martin, Bierlein, Prestin and Farhat and referred to Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies, the judicial branch, and the legislative branch for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

10 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

11 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

12 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
 13 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under
 14 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025 is
 15 \$6,000,000.00 and total state spending from state sources to be
 16 paid to local units of government is \$0.00.

17 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
 18 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,
 19 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made
 20 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget
 21 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

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23 **DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY**

24 Sec. 301. Funds appropriated in part 1 for contracted
 25 ambulance providers must be used by the department to reimburse
 26 ambulance providers that are in full compliance with section 20921
 27 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20921, and that can
 28 verify they are owed payments by a provider of health care services
 29 the department of corrections contracted with for services between

1 the years of 2023 and 2024.

2 Sec. 302. (1) Within 30 days of the effective date of this
3 act, the department shall collaborate with the department of
4 corrections to develop a grant application that includes, but is
5 not limited to, all of the following:

6 (a) The name of the ambulance provider applying for a grant.

7 (b) The location of the principal office of the ambulance
8 provider.

9 (c) The grant amount sought by the ambulance provider.

10 (d) Documentation supporting the grant amount sought by the
11 ambulance provider.

12 (2) The department shall publish the grant application on the
13 department's publicly accessible website immediately upon
14 development.

15 (3) The department shall allow 30 days from publication of the
16 application for potential grant recipients to apply for grant
17 funding.

18 (4) The department shall distribute grant funding not later
19 than 30 days after the grant application window is closed.

20 Sec. 303. If any recipient of grant funding provided under
21 this section receives reimbursement of services provided through a
22 litigation settlement, funding received through the litigation
23 settlement must be returned to this state.

24 Sec. 304. (1) Funds distributed to ambulance providers must
25 not exceed the amount agreed to by the former provider of health
26 care services.

27 (2) Any funds remaining after the debt to ambulance providers
28 has been satisfied must lapse to the state general fund.
