A bill to encourage public employers to conduct an expedited hiring process for certain individuals.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Public employer" means this state, a city, village,
- 3 township, county, or other political subdivision of this state; any
- 4 intergovernmental, metropolitan, or local department, agency, or
- 5 authority, or other local political subdivision; a school district,
- 6 a public school academy, or an intermediate school district, as
- 7 those terms are defined in the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,

- 1 MCL 380.1 to 380.1852; or a community college or junior college
- 2 described in section 7 of article VIII of the state constitution of
- 3 1963. Public employer includes a public university that elects to
- 4 come under the provisions of this act.
- 5 (b) "Reemployment team" means a team created under the
- 6 reemployment services for dislocated federal employees act.
- 7 Sec. 3. (1) A public employer that receives a referral for
- 8 employment for an individual from the reemployment team under the
- 9 reemployment services for dislocated federal employees act is
- 10 strongly encouraged to conduct an expedited hiring process for
- 11 employment for that individual. If the public employer is this
- 12 state, an employment referral and expedited hiring process must
- 13 comply with section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of
- **14** 1963.
