

HOUSE BILL NO. 4838

September 04, 2025, Introduced by Rep. Lightner and referred to Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make, supplement, adjust, and consolidate appropriations for various state departments and agencies, the judicial branch, and the legislative branch for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. In accordance with section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, total state spending from state sources under part 1 is \$0.00 and total state spending from state sources under part 1 to be paid to local units of government is \$0.00. The following itemized statement identifies appropriations from which spending to local units of government will occur:

Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under

1 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount
2 appropriated under this article, the legislature may, by a
3 concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected
4 to and serving in each house, intertransfer funds for the
5 particular department, board, commission, officer, or institution.
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7 **DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY - OPERATIONS**

8 Sec. 301. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for local
9 prosecutor support grants, the department of treasury shall award
10 grants to eligible offices of county prosecutors to reduce the
11 average caseload per attorney. An office of a county prosecutor is
12 eligible for a grant if the office meets all of the following
13 requirements:

14 (a) The amount of funding the office receives from the county
15 for the county's 2025 fiscal year is not less than the amount of
16 funding the office received from the county in the immediately
17 preceding fiscal year.

18 (b) The county is 1 of the top 15 counties with the highest
19 violent crime rate per 1,000 residents as determined for each
20 county. The violent crime rate is calculated by first dividing the
21 number described in subparagraph (i) by the number described in
22 subparagraph (ii) and then multiplying the result by 1,000:

23 (i) The total violent crime incidents reported for the county
24 according to the most recent annual crime report prepared by the
25 department of state police that is available as of April 1 of the
26 immediately preceding state fiscal year.

27 (ii) The total population of the county according to the most
28 recent federal decennial census.

29 (c) The office applies for a grant in a form and manner as

1 determined by the department of treasury and includes with its
2 application a proposed budget designating that grant proceeds will
3 be used only to support costs that reduce the average caseload per
4 attorney.

5 (d) The office submits a report that includes, at a minimum,
6 the current number of staff, the average caseload per attorney, and
7 the local funding that supports the office for both the county's
8 2025 fiscal year and the immediately preceding fiscal year.

9 (2) Subject to subsection (4), the amount of the grant to each
10 office of a county prosecutor under subsection (1) must be the
11 greater of either of the following:

12 (a) The amount received under section 991 of article 5 of 2023
13 PA 119.

14 (b) An amount equal to the product of \$7.50 multiplied by the
15 population of the county in which the office of the county
16 prosecutor is located according to the most recent federal
17 decennial census.

18 (3) If any grant money remains after determining the initial
19 grant award amounts under subsection (2), the remaining money must
20 be returned to the state general fund.

21 (4) If the total amount appropriated for local prosecutor
22 support grants does not support the full grant amounts determined
23 under subsection (2), then the grant amount determined under
24 subsection (2) for each office that meets all of the requirements
25 of subsection (1) shall be reduced on a per capita basis determined
26 by the population of the county in which the office is located
27 according to the most recent federal decennial census.

28 (5) The department shall not use any of the funds appropriated
29 under this section for administration.

1 (6) Not later than August 1, the department shall submit a
2 report to the senate and house appropriations committees, the
3 senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office that
4 includes all of the following:

5 (a) A list of all of the offices of a county prosecutor that
6 received a grant under this section.

7 (b) The information required under subsection (1)(d).

8 (c) The initial amount awarded to each office under subsection
9 (2) before any adjustment under subsection (4).

10 (d) If the initial amount under subsection (2) is reduced
11 under subsection (4), the amount of the reduction under subsection
12 (4) for each office.

13 (e) The total amount awarded to each office of a county
14 prosecutor under this section.

15 (7) As used in this section, "office" means an office of a
16 county prosecutor.
