HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 61

Reps. Fox, Roth, Borton, DeSana, Schriver, DeBoer, Alexander, Wortz, Schuette, Smit, Markkanen, Slagh, Johnsen, Rigas, Hoadley, Breen, Lightner, Outman, Posthumus, Rheingans and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare April 13-20, 2025, as Holy Week in the
- 2 state of Michigan and to extend best wishes to Christians in
- 3 Michigan, the United States, and worldwide, for a joyous and
- 4 meaningful observance of Holy Week, culminating in Easter Sunday,
- 5 when all Christians celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.
- 6 Whereas, This occasion is observed as a time to remember the
- 7 life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ at the end
- 8 of his earthly ministry. Christians everywhere rejoice in the
- 9 completion of Jesus' redemptive work as he rose from the grave
- 10 three days after dying on a cross. Christians today also observe
- 11 Holy Week in keeping with nearly two thousand years of Church

history that began with Jesus' victory over death; and 1 Whereas, Christians in Michigan, our nation, and around the 2 world remember with gratitude and reverence the works of Jesus as 3 he entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, was betrayed to worldly and 4 religious authorities on Maundy Thursday, was crucified on Good 5 6 Friday, and rose again on Easter Sunday; and 7 Whereas, Throughout two thousand years, on Easter Sunday, 8 faithful followers of Christ exclaim "He is Risen!" to one another and respond by declaring "He is Risen indeed!" to recall the 9 10 living, eternal hope that they each have in the life of Christ; and 11 Whereas, During Holy Week, Christians remember Jesus' work by reading and studying the Bible, especially the historical events of 12 Jesus as described in the Gospels, by praying and by attending 13 church services on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, the latter of 14 15 which is considered the high point of the Christian calendar; and 16 Whereas, This year, Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday, April 13, and concludes on Easter Sunday, April 20; now, therefore, be it 17 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 18 this legislative body declare April 13-20, 2025, as Holy Week in 19 20 the state of Michigan and extend best wishes to Christians in Michigan, the United States, and worldwide, for a joyous and 21 meaningful observance of Holy Week, culminating in Easter Sunday, 22 when all Christians celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. 23
