## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 21

Senators Cavanagh, Bayer, Chang, Geiss, McMorrow and Santana offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to designate March 25, 2025, as Equal Pay Day.
- Whereas, It has been 62 years since the passage of the Equal
- ${f 3}$  Pay Act. Even with the passage of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act
- 4 just one year later, women and people of color continue to suffer
- 5 the consequences of inequitable pay differentials; and
- 6 Whereas, Equal Pay Day takes place on the day of the year on
- 7 which the earnings of women catch up to the average earnings of
- 8 men. The calculation is based on the 2019 United States Census data
- 9 on median earnings for full-time, year-round workers. Women on
- 10 average make 82 cents compared to one dollar for men on average in
- 11 the United States; and
- 12 Whereas, Pay discrimination also heavily impacts women in
- 13 other ethnic and racial groups, with significant disparities seen

- 1 for Black, Native American, Latina, and Asian American and Pacific
- 2 Islander women; and
- 3 Whereas, Over a working lifetime, wage disparity costs the
- 4 average American woman and her family, impacting retirement savings
- 5 programs, Social Security benefits, and pensions. This has
- 6 contributed to an overarching wealth gap between men and women,
- 7 with women owning only 32 cents for every dollar owned by men; and
- 8 Whereas, Ongoing wage disparities for women are further
- 9 exacerbated by significant shocks to the economy, such as the
- 10 COVID-19 pandemic. Labor force participation among women in
- 11 Michigan fell nearly six percent during the COVID-19 pandemic
- 12 compared to less than one percent for men, furthering wage and
- 13 wealth inequality. Economic forecasters estimate the COVID-19
- 14 pandemic will likely lead to significant challenges for women in
- 15 the labor market in the future, including lower wages and fewer job
- 16 opportunities; and
- 17 Whereas, Pay discrimination based on any factor is wrong.
- 18 Employees should be compensated by their employers based solely on
- 19 their merits; and
- 20 Whereas, Fair pay strengthens the security of families today
- 21 and eases future retirement costs, while enhancing the American
- 22 economy; now, therefore, be it
- 23 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 24 body designate March 25, 2025, as Equal Pay Day. We encourage
- 25 Michigan's citizens to recognize the full value of women's skills
- 26 and significant contributions to the labor force.
