- 3 Whereas, Since 1993, the United Nations has designated March
- 4 22 as World Water Day; and
- 5 Whereas, The theme of World Water Day 2025 is glacier
- 6 preservation, emphasizing the need for global action to manage
- 7 meltwater sustainably and reduce emissions, securing vital water
- 8 resources for the future; and
- 9 Whereas, The Great Lakes State was shaped by glaciers, and the
- 10 Great Lakes themselves contain 20 percent of the world's surface
- 11 freshwater that is not locked up in glaciers; and
- 12 Whereas, Freshwater supplies drinking water, water to grow
- 13 crops and support industry, water to support recreation, and water

         Whereas, The abundance of water that characterizes Michigan

         Whereas, Michigan's boundaries include approximately 38,000

    square miles of Great Lakes surface water and bottomlands, an
