## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 36

Senators Anthony, Chang, McMorrow and Polehanki offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize April 28, 2025, as Workers' Memorial
- 2 Day.
- 3 Whereas, Every year on April 28, communities and worksites
- 4 around the world honor friends, family members, and colleagues who
- 5 have been killed or injured on the job; and
- 6 Whereas, In 2023, The Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics
- 7 estimated that 5,283 workers were killed by traumatic injuries on
- 8 the job. On average, a worker died every 99 minutes from a work-
- 9 related injury; and
- 10 Whereas, In Michigan, 166 workers were lost through fatal
- 11 workplace accidents in 2023; and
- 12 Whereas, It is appropriate to honor the memory of the
- 13 courageous and dedicated members of Michigan's labor force who have

- 1 been injured or disabled or have died as a result of workplace
- 2 accidents; and
- 3 Whereas, It is necessary to recognize the integrity of
- 4 Michigan's workforce and its achievements on behalf of the economic

- 5 growth of our state; and
- 6 Whereas, We remember those who have died in workplace
- 7 catastrophes, suffered occupation-related diseases, or have been
- 8 injured due to dangerous conditions; and
- 9 Whereas, We renew our effort to seek stronger workplace safety
- 10 and health protections, better standards, enforcement, and fair and
- 11 just compensation. We rededicate ourselves to improving both safety
- 12 and health in every workplace; now therefore, be it
- 13 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 14 body recognize April 28, 2025, as Workers' Memorial Day. We pay
- 15 tribute to the workers who have died or been injured or disabled in
- 16 workplace accidents; and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That we urge all citizens to recognize and honor the
- 18 contributions of Michigan's workforce and call for increased
- 19 workplace safety standards.
