## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 57

Senators Bumstead, Bayer, Cherry, Santana and Webber offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Sport
- 2 Fish Restoration Program.
- 3 Whereas, More than a century ago, hunters and anglers were
- 4 among the first conservationists who realized America's natural
- 5 resources were in peril and could not sustain unregulated harvest
- 6 and habitat destruction; and
- 7 Whereas, Sportsmen and women took it upon themselves to
- 8 support laws that stopped excessive harvest of fish and wildlife,
- 9 established state agencies to protect fish, wildlife, and their
- 10 habitat, and supported special fishing and hunting license fees to
- 11 help fund these efforts to provide healthy natural resources for
- 12 future generations; and
- 13 Whereas, The Sport Fish Restoration Program, which began with

- 1 the passage of the Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration Act in
- 2 1950, (further expanded with the Wallop Breaux amendment to the
- 3 Sport Fish Restoration Act in 1984) is a vital part of conservation
- 4 funding in the United States (U.S.); and
- 5 Whereas, We recognize that the primary authority to protect
- 6 and manage fish within state waters resides in the state agencies;
- 7 and
- 8 Whereas, Upon realizing that license fees alone were
- 9 insufficient to restore and sustain healthy fish populations,
- 10 anglers supported excise taxes on fishing equipment to raise
- 11 additional funds to support restoration and enhancement efforts of
- 12 the state agencies; and
- 13 Whereas, A manufacturers' excise tax on fishing equipment,
- 14 along with an excise tax on motorboat and small engine fuels, is
- 15 mostly distributed back to the states through the U.S. Fish and
- 16 Wildlife Service for fisheries conservation, management, and angler
- 17 and boater access; and
- 18 Whereas, Since 1939, the combined contribution of the Sport
- 19 Fish Restoration Program and license fees to state fish and
- 20 wildlife agencies exceeds \$78 billion more than any other single
- 21 conservation effort in American history which constitute,
- 22 collectively, the American System of Conservation Funding; and
- 23 Whereas, This cooperative partnership between the sportfishing
- 24 industry, anglers, boaters, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and
- 25 state agencies has resulted in the most successful model of
- 26 fisheries management in the world, restoring and enhancing
- 27 populations across the U.S. and its territories; now, therefore, be
- 28 it
- 29 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative

- 1 body commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Sport Fish Restoration
- 2 Program; and be it further
- Resolved, That we recognize America's anglers, boaters, the
- 4 sportfishing industry, state fish and wildlife agencies, and the
- 5 U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for their leading role in restoring
- 6 healthy populations of fish and aquatic resources, both game and
- 7 non-game, to the abundance we see today.
