## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 22

Rep. O'Neal offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare February 2025 as Black History Month
- 2 in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The origins of Black History Month began in 1915
- 4 after the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution
- 5 abolished slavery in the United States. Since 1976, every U.S.
- 6 President has adopted the month of February as Black History Month,
- 7 an annual celebration of African-American achievements and roles in
- 8 our history; and
- 9 Whereas, As a result of the civil rights movement and a
- 10 growing awareness of black identity, Black History Month is a time
- 11 to reflect on the burdens of racial prejudice and explore,
- 12 understand and appreciate the identities and cultures across and
- 13 within the African diaspora; and
- 14 Whereas, We pay tribute to Dr. Carter G. Woodson, who

- 1 organized a national Negro History Week as an initiative to bring
- 2 national attention to the contributions of black people throughout
- 3 American history, evolving into a month-long celebration of black
- 4 progress and power; and
- 5 Whereas, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black
- 6 History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to "seize the
- 7 opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of
- 8 black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history";
- 9 and
- 10 Whereas, Michigan recognizes the injustices that African
- 11 Americans have endured and commends the African-American community
- 12 for the continuous pursuit of overcoming those injustices while
- 13 changing the course and nature of history. We honor the prominent
- 14 leaders and activists who have paved the way for equality and
- 15 justice; now, therefore, be it
- 16 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 17 this legislative body declare February 2025 as Black History Month
- 18 in the state of Michigan; and be it further
- 19 Resolved, That we honor the contributions and sacrifices made
- 20 toward building pride in black history and educating all Americans;
- 21 and be it further
- 22 Resolved, That we join other organizations throughout the
- 23 state of Michigan and this country to use this occasion to raise
- 24 awareness about the hardships African-Americans have endured,
- 25 celebrate the milestones achieved and to continue the unrelenting
- 26 pursuit of equality and justice for all.
