

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 75

Reps. Wegela, McKinney, Morgan, Pohutsky, Dievendorf, Wilson, Weiss, Rheingans and MacDonell offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to urge the United States House of
2 Representatives to introduce and adopt articles of impeachment
3 against President Donald J. Trump for the high crimes of repeatedly
4 undermining the Constitution of the United States.

5 Whereas, United States President Donald J. Trump took the oath
6 of office on January 20, 2025, swearing that he would, to the best
7 of his ability, "preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of
8 the United States." He has failed to uphold this oath, and has
9 instead repeatedly violated rights protected by the Constitution;
10 and

11 Whereas, The Fifth Amendment to the United States Constitution
12 states that no person shall be "deprived of life, liberty, or
13 property, without due process of law." The due process rights of

1 foreign nationals, however, have not been defended under the
2 current administration; and

3 Whereas, The Trump Administration has clearly demonstrated its
4 lack of respect for the constitutional constraints on the executive
5 branch in the immigration context. For example, the Trump
6 Administration unlawfully detained and removed Kilmar Armando
7 Ábrego García from the United States, and he is now being held in a
8 foreign detention center. Despite the fact that the Supreme Court
9 of the United States, in a unanimous, 9-0 decision, upheld an order
10 directing the government to facilitate his return, President Trump
11 and his Administration have failed to facilitate Ábrego García's
12 safe return to this country. The Trump Administration has also
13 fought for the deportation of Mahmoud Khalil on the basis of
14 disagreements in foreign policy, even though Khalil has not been
15 accused of, charged with, or convicted of any crime, let alone one
16 relevant to his immigration status; and

17 Whereas, The Trump Administration has also begun revoking the
18 visas of large numbers of international students. Some students
19 have had their records in the Student and Exchange Visitor
20 Information System terminated without notification, and many are
21 confused as to why they have been targeted. Visas have been
22 cancelled for students attending the University of Michigan,
23 Michigan State University, and Grand Valley State University, among
24 others; and

25 Whereas, President Trump has even expressed interest in the
26 unthinkable move of deporting United States citizens; and

27 Whereas, These cases are representative of a larger policy of
28 reckless abuse of authority to undermine due process and, in turn,
29 the protection of other fundamental American rights such as free

1 speech and freedom of assembly; and

2 Whereas, Article II, Section 4 of the United States
3 Constitution states that "[t]he President, Vice President and all
4 civil Officers of the United States, shall be removed from Office
5 on Impeachment for, and Conviction of, Treason, Bribery, or other
6 high Crimes and Misdemeanors." The United States House of
7 Representatives has the sole power of impeachment under Article I,
8 Section 2, Clause 5, and the United States Senate has the sole
9 power to try impeachments under Article I, Section 3, Clause 6;
10 now, therefore, be it

11 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the
12 United States House of Representatives to introduce and adopt
13 articles of impeachment against President Donald J. Trump for the
14 high crimes of repeatedly undermining the Constitution of the
15 United States; and be it further

16 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
17 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and the
18 members of the Michigan congressional delegation; and be it further

19 Resolved, That we request a personal response to this
20 resolution be sent from the Office of the Clerk of the United
21 States House of Representatives to the Speaker of the Michigan
22 House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the Michigan
23 Senate within one month of receipt.
