551.201 Issuance of marriage license without publicity; order.

Sec. 1.

- (1) When an individual desires to keep the exact date of his or her marriage to an individual of the opposite sex a secret, the probate judge may issue, without publicity, a marriage license to any individual making application, under oath, if there is good reason expressed in the application and determined to be sufficient by the probate judge.
- (2) The probate judge may authorize an order nunc pro tunc regarding the date to appear on the marriage license.
